This worked perfectly，except that I didn＇t leave enough slack as I switched from one side to the other，so the two layers are kind of stuck together at the＂edges．＂

## Part 2

On one side，work normally．On the second side，heavy grid lines indicate locations to do a YO in the stranded color，which will be dropped on the next row．The extra length may help minimize the pulling－in of the strands without leaving too much slack and without being more fiddly than simply trying to leave the floats long enough．
